New Hotel - European Plan Double or Twin \$14 to \$16 Single Room \$10 to \$13 Motor Inn - European Plan Double or Twin \$11 to \$12 Single Room \$8 to \$50 Motor Lodge, European Plan Double or Twin \$11 to \$13 Single Room \$8 to \$10 For more than two persons, add \$2 for each additional. All rooms have two double beds. (4 persons sharing room maximum total would be \$20).



THE BRIDGE: The magnificent Natural Bridge of Virginia can be visited both by day and night throughout the year. Each night the Drama of Creation, an illumination and pageant, is presented under the Bridge. A single adult admission is \$1.50 (either day or night), and admission for children 6-12 years of age is 75c. A special adult combination admission is \$2.25 (both day and night) and combination admission for children 6-12 is \$1.20. There is no charge for children under 6 years of age.

ICE SKATING RINK: This new rink is open November through March with skating every morning, afternoon and evening.

ROCKBRIDGE CENTER: This structure houses the ticket office for Bridge admissions, a large air-condiced Cafeteria seating 400, gift shop, snack bar, table tennis, and heated, indoor swimming pool which is open the year around and is equipped with an outdoor beach for summer use. This pool is available only for guests of our Hotel, Inn and Lodge and there is no charge for its use.

MEALS: Meals may be taken in our air-conditioned Cafeteria in the Rockbridge Center or in our Colonial Dining Room in the new Hotel. Both are noted for unsurpassed Southern food, excellent service and popular prices.

TENNIS COURTS: The new year-round "Teniflex" tennis courts are available to our guests free of charge. Tennis shoes are required.
