


MODIFICATION FOR THE HEATH TWO-ER (and others). From Ham-Hum, Ak-Sar-Ben ARC, Omaha, Dick Eilers, Ed (ARNS)

Dayton Phifer, WØVEA, sends in this circuit which he recomends for those super-regenerative receivers presumably such as the Heath.



The circuit is called the bridge squelch - installation of the bridge cuts down the rip-saw buzz of a super-regen receiver o.k. and opening the volume control about three-fourths there is a null, just barely any hum audible, but even weak signal will break the squelch. Some volume is lost, but the decrease of noise more than compensates for this. If you use sockets for the lamp bulbs, try changing bulbs, different ratings, etc. There is often an improvement.

Places

NEEDED: A double pole double throw switch, two single pole double throw switches, a battery, a flashlight bulb in a socket.

DO THIS: Make the connections as shown in the lower drawing, and by changing the positions of the blades the lamp can be turned either on or off from either of the three switches (each switch must be closed one way or the other at all times).

The upper drawing shows how the connections are made in commercial wiring in a house.
