



Think it Over.....

Jim fisk, WIDTY in an editorial - Ham Radio Sept. '68 - points out the pressuries building up for more VHF and UHF frequencies. It seems that IEEE and the EIA have recommended that FCC take a lock at space allocation on a basis of need and use rather than the existing "Block" allocations. This will doubtless put "our" frequencies under a critical gaze. Let me quote a portion of Jim's Writing.

"Although no action is expected this year, things are apt to happen when the new president takes office. However, before the government makes any drastic changes, they'll probably set up a pilot project in a representative region to test the recommended frequency allocation concepts. NOW is the time to think about VHF --- not after the serious action starts. Conduct your close-in communications and rag chews on the bands above 100 MHz., resolve to get on 220 and 432 MHz; and if you are already on 432 MHz, consider going to 1296 and 2304 MHz. If you're a member of a local traffic net, consider noving from 75 meters to VHF--- you will get the same coverage with less QRM. We may not be able to save everything from the other frequency-hungry services, but we should give it a jolly good try."
