event! This event provided an opportunity for everyone to get to know one another on a more personal level and to share their interests with fellow club members. There was a multitude of amazing foods and the conversation was equally wonderful. Since that meeting, there has been discussion of possibly meeting for the social aspect of the hobby more often. Right now, we are in the planning stages of organizing the next event in July. Hope to see you there!

The "Bacon Bits" points system that has been developed and implemented helps to recognize those who are most active in our club. By participating in club events such as the VE test sessions, Wednesday Night Nets, attending club meetings, and operating/participating in club events members earn points. At the end of the year, each and every member that has received at least 5 points will receive a certificate of recognition to thank them for their efforts. In addition to a certificate, the "Top 3" in Bacon Bits Points will receive a plaque and a gift card. This system is also being used as a tracking tool for us to be able to review participation levels during our events as well as to recognize those who "go the extra mile" to benefit the club, community, and Amateur Radio.

Being the leader of the Roanoke Valley Amateur Radio Club isn't a one person job. Help me to serve you by offering me your ideas, support, and/or suggestions. I value your input and will continue to move our club forward in a positive direction. 

ACTIVITY REPORTS

2011 FIELD DAY - GOTA

The GOTA station at Field Day did very well this year. It was on the air all but two hours of the 24-hour limit. We had seven youth operators, with five of them logging a contact for a 100 bonus. Also we had 6 individuals logging at least 20 contacts for an additional 120 bonus, which was doubled because of a full-time coach. This gave the GOTA station 340 points in bonus points. We had a total of 150 phone contacts and 12 digital contacts at 100 W. Phone being worth one and digital two with a power multiplier of three, we were able to contribute 742 points to our total score.

Friday I arrived a little late on site about 8:30am, because of a second trip to the storage unit. Put up the signs on the way in while listening to Ray AB4YZ (our host) run the Weed-eater for an hour. First order of business is always getting the drinks and water out for our workers but it started to rain (the only bad weather we saw all weekend). After a rain delay the help started showing up. We started setting up the GOTA station; pop-up shelter first just in case it started raining again, table and chairs and computer with a shop light. The generator arrived so we changed to that project. Power cables were rolled out and I added an extension cord to the GOTA station. By now it's about 20 minutes after 2 o'clock so we set up the 40 m station with the club FT-990. I left the work crew to put the 80m and 40m phone dipoles while I put the club vertical antenna up. When I returned to the tent the lights were on, so we set up the radios and computer and powered them up. Set the computer up for PSK31 with DigiPan and hit Tune. Turned the power down to 50 W. Everything works great, made two or three contacts on 20 m and 40 m to demonstrate to digital mode to our work crew. We're on the air with no problems. Something is definitely wrong when we have no

problems. Take a little time to set up my personal tent since we're ahead.

Quick break to check on the 40 m station and grab a drink. They're up and running also. Work crew having a little trouble with the 80 m dipole but they're going to persevere. Walk over to the CW station but they already have the beam and the 40m CW dipole up. Good work everyone.

Socialized with every one for a while and had a wonderful club meeting in the outdoors. The group that's going to work the satellite arrived during the meeting, so everyone went out to eat while they set their equipment up and watched the site. No one was going to operate so the generator was turned off. Return to camp, total quietness with crickets and a Whippoorwill way up in the holler. This has to be one of my favorite times at Field Day. No fire yet, just some soft noises from the younger crowd working on the satellite station.

Saturday started with a quick trip out to Hardee's and Kroger's for ice. Field Day site looks like an ant farm. Five hours until we can start operating. Fire up the generator and check out the radios. It acts like we don't have an antenna, now this is more like Field Day. Linda N4LCL went to check the club vertical, she just touches the connection and it starts working. HIT TUNE !!! Hi SWR's!!! Take the connection apart to find a loose wire but Dave KS4BO has a soldering iron. Before we can repair the jumper, Ray has an electrical problem with his air-conditioning to the RV. THIS is DEFINITELY FIELD DAY. Return to find someone has already repaired the jumper, we're on the air finally. Charlie AB4SK fine-tunes the vertical antenna. Even have time for a quick lunch. A nice group of under 18 year old operators are ready to start things off. Our star operator has to be Hannah Webber an 8-year-old. By the end of Field Day, she could call CQ or Hunt and Pounce like an oldtimer. Hope all of the other operators had as much fun as she did.

Hamfest 2011 Report
